GOD'S DESIGN

MAN'S **BROKENNESS** THE GOSPEL RESTORES

THE PHILOSOPHICAL QUESTION

Is God willing to prevent evil, but not able? Then He is not omnipotent.

Is He able, but not willing?

Then He is malevolent. Is He **both** able and willing? Then why is there evil?

Is He neither able nor willing? Then why call Him God

EPICURUS (Greek Philosopher)

A RESPONSE for THOSE GOING THRU SUFFERING

How should we respond when others are suffering

- ♦ Always be aware what you say and not to say
- ◆ Sometimes it is best to say nothing
- ◆ Be a comfort to those in need_ (2 corinthians 1:3-7)
- Be truth and strength to those in need
- Be a light to those in need (point them to Christ)

THE CROSS OF CHRIST PROVIDES! THE GREATEST **COMFORT** THRU **SUFFERING**

◆ The **ORIGIN** of Evil ▶ **SIN** (genesis 3)

- is wicked ◆ The **DEPTH** of Evil (genesis 6:5; jeremiah 17:9
- ◆ The **EXTENT** of Evil (romans 5:12-21; 8:18-22)



- ◆ The **INEXPLICABILITY** of Evil ▶ (job; isaiah 55:7; psalm 8:1)
- ◆The FINALITY of Evil (revelation 21:1-4)

3 A REASON FOR SUFFERING

A Few Things we often say...

- Matter of Perspective
- God is more than just "good" and "powerful"
- Evil defines Good (Reminds us how bad sin is, and how merciful God is)

A FEW RESPONSES:

- Greater Good Defense
- ◆ Free Will Defense (Matthew 23:37)
- ◆ Judgment/Discipline
- Creation-Order Theodicy

(God created the world according to a designed order, which includes suffering. He doesn't promise to prevent it all but He does promise to redeem us from it)

A FEW WAYS GOD USES SUFFERING:

- For good (genesis 50:20; habakkuk 1:5-11)
- To discipline (psalm 32; hebrews 12:3-11; deuteronomy 20:16-17)
- To show us something better (romans 8:18)
- For His glory (john 9:3)
- For our growth (colossians 1:24-29)

THE CROSS OF CHRIST IS THE GREATEST **EXAMPLE OF SUFFERING**

THE PROBLEM OF SUFFERING

RESPONSE from GOD to SUFFERING

WE NEED TO UNDERSTAND:

- How **BAD** we are (matthew 15:18-19; romans 3:10)
- How HOLY God is (exodus 15:11; 1 samuel 2:2; psalm 24:3-5)
- ◆ Sometimes God does step in and prevent suffering....

That's God's... PROVIDENCE

Other times God chooses not to step in and prevent suffering....

That's God's... SOVEREIGNTY

THE CROSS OF CHRIST IS THE THE GREATEST **RESPONSE** TO OUR SUFFERING

QUESTION

If we saw suffering about to happen and would stop it, but God doesn't....

DOES THAT MAKE US MORE MORAL THAN GOD?

- Who SERVES Whom? (God is not subject to man)
- Is morality determined by one act or an entire character?

(God is HOLY all the time, in every way)

♦ Which instances would He prevent?

If God stepped in every time, it would:

- disrupt the natural order of physical life
- hinder the full exercise of moral freedom
- disrupt the natural order for making rational and moral choices
- defeat the conditions of moral improvement
- hinder one of God's most effective ways of providing moral warnings
